**Question 1:** Was there any specific area that this message challenged in you?

- They were dishonouring and disregarding each other (1 Corinthians 3:3, 11:29).
- We need to learn to forgive as God forgives us in Jesus.
- We must not make a ritual out of or be light-hearted about the meaning of communion.

**Question 3:** What does it mean to examine ourselves before we have communion (1 Corinthians 11:28)?

- It means to search your heart regarding relationships with people and God. Do you need to fix any broken relationships, or repent of any offenses or sins?
