

The below notes and suggested answers are merely pointers to aid group discussion and assist with facilitating conversation around the main values from each video.

Summary

- Leviticus 19:33-34
- Matthew 10:40-42
- Romans 12:13

Discussion Questions

Question 1: Why does God want us to practice hospitality?

- God Himself loves and reached out to us when we weren't looking for Him (Leviticus 19:33-34).
- Jesus commanded us to love one another.
- By doing so, we reflect the Gospel to the world.

Question 2: What is the difference between entertaining and hosting?

• Remember, as a leader, the aim is to remove the expectation to have a 'perfect home' or lay out an extravagant meal, etc.

Question 3: Ask the group to share personal stories of being impacted by someone showing hospitality to them.

Question 4: In what creative ways could you show hospitality if you live with your parents, or don't have your own place?

• You don't need a big home/your own home to show hospitality. All that matters is that you are loving others and inviting them into your world, for Jesus.

Challenge

Pray together and commit afresh to reflecting the heart of God in the area of hospitality. Challenge one another on making it practical and encourage the group to set out a time in their schedules to invite others over.
